otal Consecration to the Immaculata means setting yourself aside for service to God. The Church has always advocated consecrating yourself to Jesus Christ through the Blessed Virgin Mary, the perfect model of discipleship. The Militia of the Immaculata (MI) is committed to providing young people with Catholic formation in the Franciscan spirit and mission of St. Maximilian Kolbe. By the Martyr of Charity's example, young lives are transformed into instruments of "youth evangelizing youth," with a mission to transform the world with authentic and heroic love.

Perhaps the best-known advocate of Marian consecration is St. Louis de Montfort. Modern-day promoters include St. Pope John Paul II, who recommended an "act of entrustment" to Mary (the Holy Father's papal motto was an enthusiastic *Totus Tuus*, "Totally Yours.") All methods are equally worthy; Kolbean consecration adds a clear apostolic dimension.

As a young person, when you make an Act of Total Consecration to the Immaculata, you are encouraged to:




- Proclaim the message of hope to other young people;
- Expose yourself to the richness of the Sacramental Life;
- Foster a deeper love for Jesus in the Eucharist;
- Seek formation in the teachings of the Catholic Church as revealed by God;
- Offer the gift of Consecration to Mary in the Franciscan spirit of St. Maximilian Kolbe; and
- Ignite the hearts of others to be instruments of evangelization.

May the short lessons contained in this booklet lead you to a better understanding of and appreciation for Our Lady's role in salvation history and in our lives as Marian Missionary Disciples.

n his Letter to the Galatians, Saint Paul writes, "when the appointed time had come, God sent His Son, born of a woman." This fulfilled God's

promise after Adam and Eve's disobedience to send a Redeemer (Gen 3:15). The Prophet Isaiah would later reveal that a young Jewish maiden would be chosen to become the mother of the Messiah (Is 7:14).

Mary of Nazareth was that chosen vessel who would become "the hand-maiden of the Lord" and bring Christ to our fallen world. To prepare her in total freedom, God preserved her from the stain of Original Sin and made her "full of grace" (Lk 1:28) by her Immaculate Conception.

Through her obedience of faith, the Blessed Virgin became the New Eve. She would give birth to Jesus—the New Adam—who would save us from our sins. We celebrate the mystery of the Incarnation—the Sec-ond Person of the Blessed Trinity becoming like us in all things but sin—each and every Christmas.

At baptism, each of us becomes adopted sons and daughters of our Heavenly Father. When we become a member of God's family—the Church—Jesus becomes our brother, and Mary becomes our spiritual mother. As such, the Blessed Mother desires only to draw us closer to her beloved Son, and to do the will of God as she always did.

Let us acknowledge the Blessed Virgin Mary as God's mother, and our mother too!



God's Mother Intercedes for Us

s our spiritual mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary is always attentive to our

needs—whether they be physical, emotional or spiritual. She only desires the best for us, and will intercede on our behalf so that we might know, love and serve God with all of our heart, mind and soul.

The Blessed Mother's maternal care and concern is revealed on the occasion of Jesus' first miracle. Attending a wedding with her Son and His Apostles, Mary becomes aware that the wine has run out during this special celebration. Mindful of this urgent need, she informs Jesus about the embarrassing situation.


At first, Our Lord seems to tell her that it is not the right time for Him to perform a miracle. Yet Jesus' mother simply tells the waiters at the wedding reception to "do whatever He tells you" (Jn 2:5). Jesus gives them special instructions and miraculously water is transformed into wine.

The Blessed Mother, mindful of all of our needs, wants us as her

spiritual children to seek her assistance whenever we are in need. By her powerful prayers, she will intercede for us according to God's will.

May we never fear to ask Mary for heavenly help because as our spiritual mother she truly knows best!

God's Mother is the Perfect Disciple of Jesus



When Jesus saw

he Blessed Virgin Mary was Jesus' first and most perfect disciple. By her continual

"yes," she lived her entire life in perfect conformity to God's will. Mary only wanted to do what the Lord asked of her.

We read in the Gospel about an incident when Our Lord was told that His mother and relatives came to see Him. Jesus used this opportunity to teach us a very important lesson. Christ asked, "Who is My mother? Who are my brothers?" (Mt 12:48). He then highlighted that a true disciple is "whoever does the will of My Heavenly Father" (Mt 12:50).


A faithful follower of Jesus is one who strives to follow God's will in all things—whether big or small, important or insignificant. This is the secret of sanctity.

This is most clearly seen as Mary stood at the foot of the Cross. She—as the Sorrowful Mother—united her sufferings with those of her Cru-

cified Son. Her "yes," first given at the Annunciation, was re-echoed, as she willingly offered her Son for the salvation of souls. Christ acknowledged Mary's fidelity and entrusted all of us to her by instructing, "Behold thy mother" (Jn 19:27).

May we imitate God's mother perfect discipleship and embrace His will in good times and bad as we strive to be faithful followers.



hen the Blessed Mother's mission on earth was complete, God assumed her into heaven—body and soul. She was reunited with her beloved

he Militia of the Immaculata (MI) is a worldwide evangelization movement founded by St. Maximilian Kolbe in 1917 that encourages Total Consecration to the Blessed Virgin Mary as a means of spiritual renewal for individuals and society.

The MI movement is open to all Catholics. It employs prayer as the main weapon in the spiritual battle with evil. MI members also immerse themselves in apostolic initiatives, either individually or in groups, to deepen the knowledge of the Gospel and our Catholic Faith in themselves and in others.

By consecrating themselves to Mary and joining the MI, members become her willing instrument, the woman foreshadowed in Genesis 3:15. She leads them to personal sanctification, the conversion of Church opponents and ultimately the universal reign of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Consecrating yourself to the Immaculata will be one of the most important days of your life. She will enlighten your mind, guide your will, empower your efforts and intercede for you in a special way before the throne of our Heavenly Father.

Follow these simple steps:

- SELECT the date on which you want your name recorded in the official register of the MI, preferably a Marian feast day.
- PREPARE for your consecration by spiritual reading, reciting the Rosary and receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation on or shortly before the day of your enrollment.
- GIVE YOURSELF WHOLEHEARTEDLY to Our Lady so as to let the Holy Spirit guide you on the path to holiness with her!
- IMPLORE Our Lady and St. Maximilian to show you how you may serve the Lord as an instrument of love and mercy in your life and be ready to share with everyone the gift you have received.
