

U.S. National Assembly Election Norms

The United States Militia of the Immaculata (MI) elections to be held on **8 August 2026** will be conducted via an on-line software voting program and in person voting via electronic means. You may vote via, computer, tablet or mobile device (iPhone or android). Results will be displayed in real time via our web-based meeting software and or by email.

1. The elections will be for the MI President, Vice President (VP), four Council members, and three Auditors.
2. The U.S. MI elections will be open to all MI members.
3. The minimum number of voting members to be a legally accepted vote will be 25 members.
4. For any candidate to be accepted as the winning candidate, he or she must receive 2/3rds of the actual vote total.
 - a. If after the first vote there is no declared winner, a second vote will be held, if after the second vote there is no declared winner, a third vote will be held. If after three consecutive votes there is no declared winner, the top two candidates will have a runoff vote and the candidate with a min of 2/3rds of the vote will be declared the winner. If no candidate receives 2/3rds of the vote a fifth vote will be conducted and the candidate with the majority of votes will be declared the winner.
5. To be able to vote in the U.S. MI election **you must be a registered U.S. MI member** and have registered to vote through the MI National Office prior to 29 May 2026.
 - a. You will receive information via email and or text message with information about the election.
 - b. Prior to the election, the MI National Center will send out an email with a brief biography of all the candidates seeking to be elected to all registered voters.
 - c. On the day of the election, you will receive a log in link and a security code to enable you to vote during the election.
 - d. The ballot will be provided with candidates, and you will be able to select your choice online. Additional ballots will be made available until a candidate is selected.
 - e. Each Council position will be presented to you separately for your vote, and additional ballots if needed, until a candidate is selected for each position on the Council.
6. In-person voting without electronic means will only be available as needed on site at the National Assembly location in Ave Maria, Florida.
